


Dear parents/carers,

Should your child need to self-isolate or should a year group be forced to stay at home, our aim is to provide all children with learning opportunities that are as closely matched to those that would take place in the classroom as possible. To do this, we have looked into a number of different learning platforms to find which one meets our needs and provides the most user friendly experience for our children. For these reasons, we have decided to begin using 'Just 2 Easy' to enable us to provide children with a platform to continue learning from home should we find ourselves in a situation where this is required.

Each child in school has been given a login for Just 2 Easy. To log in, follow these steps:

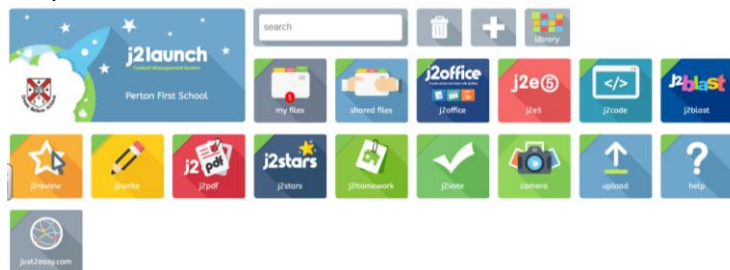
1. Visit j2e.com and fill in the log in screen with this information:
