## All adults at Perton First School want to make sure you are safe and well cared for, both in school and at home.

Sometimes children feel sad about things that happen in their lives and it can make them feel worried and alone.

# Children can feel sad or scared for lots of different reasons ...

- Someone might be hurting them or injuring their body.
- Someone might be making them feel scared.
- They might be left alone at home.
- They might feel hungry or uncared for.
- Someone might be touching them in a way they don't like.
- They might be bullied in their home or at school.
- Someone might be saying cruel things to them.

## These things are NOT okay

If you would like to share your worries you can **speak** with an **adult** in school you **trust**. They will listen to you carefully. You can also speak with a member of our **Safeguarding Team.**

- We check in with you every day with our Colour Monsters
- We have The Nest as a safe space and Miss Davies to talk to
- We have lunch clubs

• We have a special Governor (Mr Brown) who helps with safeguarding in our school
